"Contacts" is an informal gathering of artists whose work is closely linked to an emerging economic sector already designated by the term "knowledge industries". It is based on mutual exchange, customised services, and on the as yet not officially acknowledged domain of DIY and housework. The artists explore these areas of endeavour to claim possession of the flux of industrial production, and to announce new forms and relationships within the capitalist economy. The works presented in "Contacts" chart a map that blends interpersonal relationships, DIY and the active recycling of the great flow of goods.

Joseph Grigely and the notes by which he communicates with his partners; the data banks collected by Kobe Matthys; Swetlana Heger & Plamen Dejanov and their contract with BMW, which doubles and critically reflects the company's communication strategy (the contract is coming to an end shortly after the exhibition); the inter-personal strategies of Ben Kinmont and his "third sculpture", consisting of the interactions between people; Alicia Framis, who explores the solitary lives of people in today's megacities; Navin Rawanchaikul with his " taxi project - all these artists explore the realm of human relationships. Monica Bonvicini, who conducts interviews with construction workers, or Liam Gillick, whose work deals with the complex architecture of relations in the service sector, offer a particular interface to investigate the things that happen between people and the world of labour. Where does work stop? Pierre Joseph has given up on being an expert, and decided to be a lifelong apprentice. Artists such as Mathieu Mercier or Claude Closky use different means to reflect the permanent formatting of daily life - in a first step, by means of the minor domestic chores with which individuals tame their environment; in a second step, by regaining control over the flux of advertising.
